Sponsorship Fund

Provides up to \$500 in funding for projects or events that support business and economic development.

Skills Development Fund

Receive up to \$1,000 in funding for skills training projects that support business development, entrepreneurship, and / or leadership development.

Facilities & Equipment Fund

Receive up to \$2500 in funding for projects that improve the community's physical environment.

Business & Entrepreneurship Fund

Provides up to \$5000 in funding for projects that directly support job creation and economic diversification in the North Cariboo region.

LOCAL FUNDING SOURCES FOR NON-PROFIT

Cariboo Regional District

The CRD gives Grants for Assistance to non-profit groups and organizations that provide a demonstrated benefit to the community. Typically, \$500 - \$1000 grants are available for eligible societies and groups. The Grants for Assistance submission period and deadline are from August 1st to September 30th.

Quesnel Community Foundation

The Quesnel Community Foundation provides grants to charitable community groups using the interest earned from a permanent endowment fund. Funded activities provide a direct service to the community, or take an innovative approach to addressing changing needs and concerns within the North Cariboo region. Letters of intent are due in early January each year.

The Rotary Club of Quesnel provides funding for projects that yield broad community benefits and an ongoing profile to Rotary. Preference for funding goes to projects that create lasting impact and long term benefits to the community, benefit large numbers of people, and are carried out in partnership with other groups. Applications are accepted year round.
